A Message from Pastor Becca

Hope. Peace. Joy. Love.

These are the traditional themes of Advent.

This of course is not news to those of you who have been a part of the church community for some time. You are likely accustomed to hearing about these themes wrapped up in waiting and anticipation. Each year we are reminded that we wait not only for the birth of Jesus but for his much-anticipated return to Earth.

Like any story or theme, we know well it is easy to tune out and sort of go through the motions. This Advent, I invite you to slow down and reflect on each of these words, promises of our life of faith. What does it mean to have hope in December of 2021? Peace? Joy? Love?

Hope is a radical thing to have in the world right now, everywhere we turn, there is opportunity to be overwhelmed by despair. If I am honest, imagining a world where there is peace becomes harder with each passing year. Joy, real joy, is often hard to come by. I pray that love is easier to observe but that too seems to be a thing that hides from sight.

This time of year, the stories we tend to watch, the songs we gravitate toward, and even the stories we tell lean toward hope, peace, joy, and love. While they may be hard to find in real life, they are abundant in the stories we share and enjoy. At our core, we long for the very things we acknowledge in our collective Advent waiting. Yet, they are in fact not just a reminder of what is possible with God, but also part of our call as people who follow Jesus.

This Advent you are invited not only to find these four; hope, peace, joy, love, but to also bring these gifts into the world abundantly. We do not only anticipate the coming of Christ, but we do the work of Jesus with our very hands, feet, and hearts. We are the living kin-dom of God imperfect, painfully human, prone to falling short, yet chosen by God. We won't always get this right but that doesn't mean we stop trying. How can you share hope? In what ways can you work toward peace or reconciliation? Where can you find joy, even amidst sorrow? How can you love those you encounter well?

As you reflect on these themes, I pray you find new meaning in them this season. Advent blessings to you!

2022 Per Capita Payment

The Presbytery of Southern New Jersey has set the per capita payment for 2021 at **\$38.75 per member**. This is the same amount as last year. Did You Know?

Faith Church has added an **ON-LINE GIVING** option through the Presbyterian Foundation. This option is available on our website using the GIVE NOW button and on our Facebook page using the link to on-line giving (right above DONATION).

While this is a great option to give for on-line visitors to Faith Church, members of Faith Church should be aware that 2% of all donations through this service go to administrative fees and only 98% goes to the church. A better option for members, who give on a regular basis, is to use Bill Pay through the member's bank. Bill Pay, which is free and easy to set up, assures that 100% of the donation goes to Faith Church.
