



A Message from Interim Pastor Diane Curtis

Snow is coming again tomorrow (March 4th). Not much, but it is still snow. Sometimes, just when we think spring has taken hold, it snows. Here we are in the midst of our spiritual preparation for Easter with its flowers, new spring clothes, and glorious celebration of the risen Christ and it snows. Again we are reminded that the road to new life is not what we expect.

Lent is a time of expectation, as well as a time of preparation. From those words at the conclusion of the Ash Wednesday service – “Remember you are dust and to dust you will return” – through the weeks of thought, prayer, and confession, to the shouts of “Hosanna!” on Palm Sunday we consider again who we are and whose we are. Then we, like the disciples who followed Jesus, experience the emotional ups and downs of Holy Week, the recalling of Christ’s last week on earth.

Palm Sunday is the tipping point of the season of Lent. On Palm Sunday, our focus changes from ourselves to Jesus, although, as did the disciples, we waver back and forth that last week before Easter. How can we wave palms on Sunday and experience the Last Supper and Good Friday in one week? And then celebrate the resurrection at the end of it all? The truth is we can’t.

We can’t, at least not without spiritual confusion. A confusion such as led many of the disciples to run away at the crucifixion or deny that they even knew Jesus at all. Just as Peter was confronted with the reality that he really could deny his Teacher, so we, too, must consider who do we follow, whose we are. Where does our allegiance lie, with ourselves or with Jesus? Until we confront this question within ourselves, we can’t truly, completely, celebrate the resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Easter Sunday is the culmination of Lent. After the forty days of prayerful introspection, repentance, and recommitment to our faith in Jesus Christ we celebrate that we are his, that Christ is our Lord and Savior, that we again have become Easter people.

Prepare and celebrate. That is where our journey through Lent leads us. From the ashes, to the palms, to the cross, and to the resurrection. He is risen, he is risen indeed!
