



A Message from Interim Pastor Diane Curtis

I don't consider myself a very creative person. Growing up, art class was a disaster (although I can draw a pretty mean stick figure). Music wasn't much better. Sewing, knitting, decorating the house or most other similar activities is not part of my repertoire. Creativity has generally been equivalent to artistic in my book...until I looked through a different lens.

According to the dictionary, creativity is *the ability to make new things or think of new ideas*. Most of us think of creativity as the first part of this definition: make new things. But, it is the second part of the definition that opens up a new world of possibilities. If creativity is thinking of new ideas, we all have the ability to be creative.

Photographer and speaker Dewitt Jones, in his video, "Everyday Creativity," says:

Creativity, in my view, is an attitude. Much of what we call "creative thinking" really results from taking a fresh look — one that is deeper and more determined — at the mundane experiences of everyday life. Quite simply, creativity is looking at the ordinary and seeing the... extraordinary.

Creativity is an attitude. If we want to see the world in a creative way, we first need to change our perspective. We look with an expectation that we will see in a new way; that we will look beyond the ordinary to the extraordinary. A tree with leaves changing color can be beautiful. Looking closer at the individual colors of each leaf gives us a different view. Examining the intricacies of one leaf provides yet another perspective. Each picture changes our view of the fall colors and takes us to a different depth of beauty. This is creativity!

My hope for Faith Church is that we can become a creative church. One that looks beyond our own view of our identity, past the hurt and grief of our history, to see the depth of who we are and who we can become with God's help. The picture in my mind's eye of the new Faith Church is beautiful. Let's paint it!

Flu shots (regular and high dose)	Shingles Vaccine
Pneumonia shots (PPSV23 – Pneumovax & PCV13 – Prevnar)	Tdap Vaccine (whooping cough, tetanus & diphtheria)

A Rite Aid Pharmacist will administer shots and submit the claim to your insurance. If you don't have insurance, they will accept a check (\$32.99 for the regular flu shot and \$69.99 for the high dose). The **shingles vaccine must be pre-approved** through Rite Aid. Check your vaccination records before the clinic and roll up your sleeve for a healthier winter!



Leadership Retreat

On Saturday, October 1, your session and deacons gathered at the church for a half-day retreat. We began with a fellowship breakfast and got down to business about learning who we are. We introduced ourselves and told about where we were born and where we had grown up and how God had become warm to us.

This was a preamble to get us into the frame of thinking about every day creativity. For starters, we took a half empty glass of water and we asked each other whether the glass was half empty or half full. This led into a discussion on asset based approach to planning.

We divided into four groups and then listed all of the assets that we thought the church possessed. The individual assets were written on sticky notes. We then took the sticky notes and put them on the walls and tried to connect the dots; that is to say an asset connected to an asset to an asset within the church to find out what we can do with it. The process was to:

1. Recognize the church's assets
2. Set them out and try to connect the dots between various assets
3. Vote with our feet after we selected some asset connections. We moved to the connected dots that we felt drawn to.

The process disclosed several very interesting things that we can do to utilize our various assets.

- Use the church van to bring people from Medford Leas or Leisure Towne to services and church activities.
- Expand the HOPE Garden to encompass more of the community.
- Improve our website and Facebook pages to communicate to a younger audience.
- Increase interaction with the Small World community to bring members to the church.
- Host a golf outing.
- Hold garden concerts with the handbells, choir and even our violin students.
- Utilizing our parking lot as a starting point for activities within the community such as the Dickens festival and the food festival and fireworks, with perhaps a community picnic or barbecue.

These were just a few of the things that we discussed. We discovered that we have many, many assets within this church already. If the assets are seeds, we can grow them with individual and collective efforts to bring our church to its full potential.



PER CAPITA Details and Description

Each year Faith Presbyterian Church, along with the other churches in West Jersey Presbytery, is asked to make a financial contribution to the Presbytery known as *per capita*. This contribution is a set amount based on the number of members of the particular church, and is split between the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly to support the work of these governing bodies. **For 2017, the per capita is \$38.75 per member**, with a large majority of that amount supporting the work of our Presbytery. West Jersey Presbytery is absorbing the increase in per capita from the General Assembly and Synod so that the amount each church pays per person remains the same as it has for the past several years. You can help defray this cost by contributing your own per capita to the church (for each *member* in your household). This contribution will be tax deductible and will be recorded on your giving records. Thank you for your support.
