### A Message from Pastor Becca

As I sit down to write, I am full of joy after sharing a night of contemplative prayer and an Agape Meal with some of you. I treasure these moments of praying together in new ways that help us to go deeper and grow our faith. Our evening of sharing also marked the halfway point of Lent. My focus is beginning to shift to Holy Week and Easter as we prepare to worship together over the course of several days in anticipation of the Resurrection. As you know before we get to the Resurrection, we will go deep into the valley to those sacred and horrifying days of the Last Supper and Crucifixion.

I know that your lives are full of joy and struggle, that finding time to come to church three or more times in just four days' time can feel near impossible. I want to encourage you now while we are still a few weeks out to join us for one or more of our weekday worship services leading up to Easter morning. Holy Week begins with our celebratory Palm Sunday worship on April 14 at 9:30am. We will worship at 7:30 pm on Maundy Thursday April 18 and Good Friday April 19 at 5:00 pm here at Faith Presbyterian. At noon on Good Friday I will lead worship with my colleagues from around Medford at the Medford United Methodist Church. I encourage you to accept this invitation to worship on the difficult days as we approach the joy of Easter morning. If we skip over the hard and heavy stuff and go right to Easter, we rob ourselves of the full story. If we only come worship to encounter joy, we forget that God is present in the pain of our lives. These days of mourning hold a significant place in our liturgical calendar. I look forward to remembering and celebrating with you.

As a community of believers, we have been facing some of our own difficult days. We have grieved the loss of many of our staff members, we worry about budgets, we get concerned about the future. It can feel a little dark and overwhelming, we can forget about the hope and promise of resurrection! As we await the resurrection, I want to invite you to participate in the Vital Congregations program with the Presbytery. You received an email last week about this program and I will be sending more on to you as the program begins. If you are interested in praying our way into the future alongside the community of our fellow churches, please let me know!

I am so grateful for each of you and look forward to our unfolding future, trusting God is not done yet!

















### **Prayer Shawl Ministry New Meeting Day and Time** Join Us!
