### A Call to Prayer Regarding Recent Events in Syria

Our missionaries in Iraq, Rev. Greg and Chris Callison, are calling on us for serious and ongoing prayer for the Kurds and Christians in Syria. While the Callisons feel they are very safe in Iraqi Kurdistan where they are based, they also fear, along with local authorities, that if the US can abandon their cousins in Syria, ultimately how secure are they?

Greg and Chris were deeply disturbed and embarrassed by the ordered pullout of US troops in nearby Syria. They seek to be representatives of Jesus Christ, not the US. Nonetheless, they state they are American and US actions do have an impact on their witness to Christ.

Please join us in heartfelt prayer for the ongoing safety of our missionaries, the Kurdish majority and Christian minority in northern Syria, now in turmoil. "Oh Lord, hear our prayer."
