A Message from Pastor Becca

This September I was reminded of the song *We Need a Little Christmas*: "We need a little Christmas right this very minute". The song is from the musical *Mame*, when Mame begins to decorate her house just a week after Thanksgiving Day because a financial crisis has hit her (and many others as it was The Great Depression). This premature (for the time) decorating is accompanied by her singing they need a little Christmas right then in that moment, it simply cannot wait.

Has there ever been a year where we needed Christmas so badly?

Let's think back to that very first Christmas, the very day Jesus was born, the story takes us to all sorts of unexpected places. It has Mary and Joseph traveling away from home, there is birth that happens in a stable, mom and baby exposed to the elements and possibly animals. The savior of the world comes not riding into town on a horse with fanfare but is born humbly in a tiny human body in an unexpected place.

We have been worshiping in our homes for so long, many of us are eager to get back into church. The session, informed by the growing numbers of cases, has made the difficult decision to keep worshiping exclusively online. As such on Christmas Eve there will be online worship available to us in our homes. Watch your email for details in the coming weeks.

There is one exception: this Christmas we will have a unique and perhaps authentic opportunity to worship together. At 7pm on Christmas Eve we will gather out front of the church for worship. This will be a shortened service and will take place no matter what the weather (unless it is dangerous). Plan to come in your warmest coat and gloves, bring your umbrella or poncho if it rains, we will remember our baptisms. I will be sending out details about this service in the coming weeks. Masks will be required, we will social distance, and we will sing (something we cannot do indoors right now). I will need some volunteers to help with set up and clean up, sign ups will go out soon. Weather permitting, we will have fire pits for warmth, if you have one we might be able to use please let me know! As with all things right now, if state restrictions change, we will follow them.



Chocolate Orange Shortbread Cookies (Bonnie)

1 cup plus 2 tablespoons (2 1/4 sticks) cold salted butter, cut into 1/2-inch pieces 1/2 cup granulated sugar 1/4 cup packed brown sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour 12 ounces semisweet chocolate, coarsely chopped, divided Zest of 1 medium orange (about 2 tablespoons) More orange zest, for topping (optional)

- 1. In the bowl of a stand mixer with the paddle attachment, beat butter, sugars and vanilla on medium-high speed until light and fluffy, about 3 to 5 minutes.
- 2. Scrape down sides of the bowl, then stir in flour on low speed until just combined.

 Stir in 6 ounces chocolate chunks and 2 tablespoons orange zest until just incorporated.
- 3. Divide dough in half. Place each half on a large sheet of plastic wrap. Fold over plastic wrap to cover dough, then roll each piece of dough into a log about 2-2 1/4 inches in diameter. Wrap dough in plastic wrap to cover completely and chill at least 2 hours until firm (can be chilled up to 1 week).
- 4. Heat oven to 350 degrees F. Line a cookie sheet with parchment paper. Uncover one log and, using a sharp serrated knife, gently slice log into 1/2-inch-thick rounds, using a sawing motion to cut. Place cut side-up on prepared cookie sheet about 1 inch apart.
- 5. Bake 13 to 15 minutes or until edges of cookies are just beginning to brown. Cool 1 minute on cookie sheet, then transfer to cooling rack to cool completely. Repeat with second log of dough.
- 6. Melt remaining 6 ounces semisweet chocolate in microwave or in a double boiler. Dip one end of each fully cooled cookie into melted chocolate; let excess chocolate drip off, then place cookie on cooling rack. Sprinkle with more orange zest, if desired. Chill dipped cookies in fridge 30 minutes until chocolate is set.
- 7. Store cookies in an airtight container up to 5 days. (Recipe and Photo credit http://www.girlversusdough.com)

- 1. Bake the cookies as directed.
- 2. Before removing from the pan add pretzel antlers, almond ears, chocolate chip eyes, and M&M nose.
- 3. Carefully remove from baking sheet to a cooling rack.







Butter Brickle Cookies (Paige)

Heat oven to 375 degrees and line cookie sheets with parchment paper. Cream 1 cup of butter and 3/4 cup of light brown sugar and 3/4 of granulated sugar. Add 2 eggs, 1/2 tsp of salt, 1 tsp of baking soda, 1 tsp of vanilla extract. Add 2 cups of Heath English Toffee Bits. Then add 2 cups of flour. Drop a Teaspoon of dough 2" apart on lined baking sheets. Bake 8-10 minutes, then transfer to cooling racks. Store in cookie tins. SO GOOD even George likes these, I think!

Simple Shortbread Cookies (Sandy)

2 c. sifted flour 1/4 t. baking powder 2 sticks butter ½ c. powdered sugar

Sift together flour and baking powder. Work butter and sugar together and add flour mixture. Drop from spoon onto ungreased cookie sheet. Dip in sprinkles or add a candied cherry (cut in fourths) or pecan half on top, then cook. Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes.
