



## *A Message from Pastor Becca*

"Let's go to the movies!" Every time I speak or hear this sentence I sing it, the tune stuck in my head from the movie *Annie*, a childhood favorite. I have loved stories for as long as I can remember but in my adolescent years the way I enjoyed them most was on film. I longed to tell stories on the silver screen, with witty dialogue, beautiful images, and meaningful messages. Stories can reach deep into our being as we recognize part of our own experience, our own story. Over the summer I listened to the book, *Where the Crawdads Sing*, after seeing an enticing preview for the movie. Toward the end of the story, Tom Milton, Kya Clark's defense attorney, gives a speech in the court room that is perhaps the best sermon I have ever heard. Kya, is on trial for murder, Tom is wrapping up his case. He paints a very different picture of Kya and how she was treated by a town full of people who could have helped her and chose not to. I found my mouth hung open as I listened to the words. My heart leapt and I thought dang, he is preaching! I was so wrapped up in the story I ended up cheering. Interesting characters pull at our hearts and pique our curiosity. Well told stories can change us or give us renewed hope. A good plot twist can keep us engaged.

I have two invitations for you this fall. The first is a practical one, to join me on discount Tuesdays (\$5 tickets all day and evening) to see a current release a story of any kind and then gather to discuss the story. We could talk about where we saw faith, God, theology, or just plain old life. Perhaps it is a hazard of being a pastor, I tend to see theology and God everywhere and the theater is no exception. Once I have a group of interested folks we will agree on a film, date, and time.

My second invitation is to think about your own story and God's story and where they meet. In Scripture God's story is laid out in words spilling over pages written over hundreds of years. Yet God's story is not limited to the pages in our Bibles. God's story is in our hearts, in our lives, and in the lives of countless people around the world. You too have a story of your life and it intersects with God's story, more often than you might think. You do not have to pick up a book, see a film, or listen to an excellent album to encounter God in your story. As we transition back into our fall rhythms I am curious to see where God shows up unexpectedly in your life and mine. I am curious to know how your story is unfolding and where you see God and maybe where you do not.

In my own practice, I have noticed God surprises. I feel God as the surprise flower in my garden leaves me smiling for hours. I feel God as beautiful vistas take my breath away. I feel God in a speech in a fiction novel that sums up a life of faith with out ever saying a word about God. God shows up in the people around me, in the places I end up, and sometimes even when I am doing the dishes. I invite you into this practice of noticing, even seeking out God in the everyday tasks of your life, the quiet moments, and the chaotic ones. I suspect, like me, you may be surprised. I would love to hear from you about your experiences.

We've had excellent success with our very first watermelon crop, and managed to harvest 35 watermelons though a pesky groundhog presented some challenges! Just over **1,700 pounds** of fresh produce has been donated to the St. Vincent de Paul food pantries in Tabernacle and Medford and the Migrant Worker camps in Hammonton. It's time to start planting fall crops! Harvests will continue into November.

It's a real blessing to be able to share nutritious food, especially in another year of great need. A BIG thank you to everyone who cares for the garden directly, to those who donate plants and materials, and to all who give their support financially and in prayer.

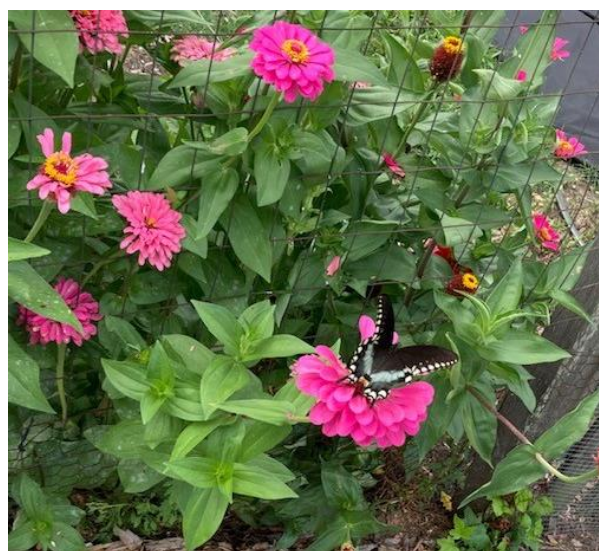

On September 13, they will be continuing a series by Rob Bell. For any questions, contact Charlie Hoffman.

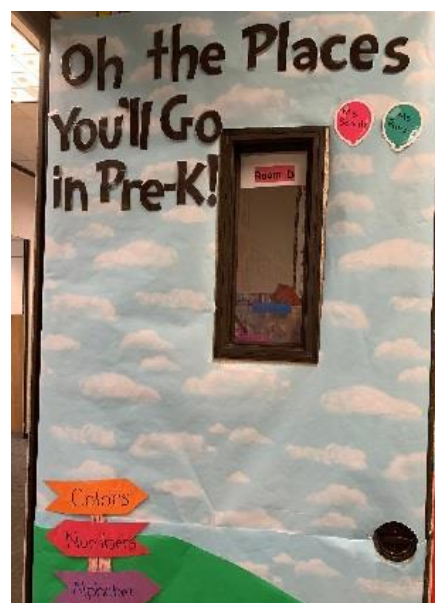


## Small World Update
