Paul's words to the Philippians are good ones for all of us to hear on a regular basis. God isn't finished working in you and me. He isn't done with his good work among us in Faith Church. In fact, God has great plans for us as a church; for our ministries, our worship, our missions, and us as a community of faith. What a promise!

This fall we begin the process of discovering and living into a new future for Faith Church. I am certain it won't look the same as what we are used to and have become comfortable with. And, it will take some time to hear together what the Lord is saying to us, to grasp where he is leading us as a church.

Our tentative plan begins in September with a Sunday school kick-off event for all ages on the 13th right after worship. Sunday morning will look like this:

- Worship continues with pre-service music at 9:20 a.m. Music will be led by the band and the organ.
- Sunday school for children and youth will have a one-room format, meeting at 10:45 a.m. Everyone will meet together with the youth serving as assistant leaders and teachers. We have a new curriculum designed especially for this format. The children will experience the varied gifts of a number of teachers throughout the fall. (Begins September 20th) Watch for more info!
- Adult Sunday school will meet at the same time as the children's program. (Start date TBD).

In addition, Morning Glories, OG's, and small groups will be available for those who are looking for additional ways to grow in faith and in study.

A Music Director Search committee has been formed and is beginning its work. In the meantime, guest organists will be with us each week. We hope to have the choir help lead in worship on occasion throughout the fall. The band will continue to be a vital part of our worship.

A stewardship emphasis is also part of the plan. Tim Pauza, Nathan Buurma, and Norm Mackey are taking the lead.

The discovery process, the mission study, will invite you into the conversation on the new future for Faith Church. John Ford will lead the team organizing and facilitating the mission study. A tentative time-line for the search for new pastoral leadership looks like this:

- September through December the mission study process, resulting in a report to be approved by Session, the congregation and the Committee on Ministry of West Jersey Presbytery. The mission study will also be our game plan for the work we will do together in preparing for a new pastor.
- January celebrating and affirming the new direction for Faith Church.
- February elect a Pastor Nominating Committee.
