

A Message from Pastor Becca

Eastertide began almost a month ago, our halleluiahs echo like a distant memory. Yet as I sit here, the world slowly turning green outside, I can't help but be filled with gratitude for the time we spent together during Holy Week in worship. I celebrate how many of you were able to participate in each of the services offered. I have savored your willingness to engage something new in worship during that time. I am grateful to each of you who helped make those worship services flow. I certainly couldn't have done it on my own.

I hope that as our seasons change, you are able to find ways to sink into a more relaxed summer rhythm that allows you plenty of space for sabbath. If you should happen to find yourself in a place of sabbath I invite you to reflect upon Scripture, particularly which verses, theme, or book has been significant to you on your faith journey. Allow me to share one such piece with you.

"I can't tell you how much I long for you to enter this wide-open, spacious life. We didn't fence you in. The smallness you feel comes from within you. Your lives aren't small, but you're living them in a small way. I'm speaking as plainly as I can and with great affection. Open up your lives. Live openly and expansively!" (2 Corinthians 6:11-13, The Message)

This was the theme of a youth worker's convention Paul and I attended just a few weeks after we were married. This is the first time I can remember scripture shaking me to my core in a large group setting, especially in a paraphrase like *The Message*. I wasn't a Corinthian, but I did feel pretty small and fenced in. I had begun to discern a call to ministry and I was absolutely terrified by the prospect. There was a long road ahead; I would have to do mountains of paperwork, learn two dead languages, get over my fear of speaking in front of people, figure out how to afford life while working internships. I was being invited in, to living expansively. In that moment, living expansively meant trusting God with all I was worried about. Trusting that the call to ministry would unfold, that it wasn't a mistake that I, of all people, heard this call. The journey would turn out to be more challenging than I had ever imagined. It was rarely easy. Though I have found my way through the required education, exams, and paperwork that precede ordination, my journey did not end on ordination day three years ago. I continue hoping to live expansively into this call.

My hope for us as a congregation is that we, too, would live expansively and open to trusting where God might lead. Trusting that God is in whatever process we find ourselves in can be incredibly difficult. Last week's sermon engaged the idea that after pruning, we await growth, not alone, but with Jesus. As a congregation you have weathered a very difficult season, it can be hard at times to see God at work, but I assure you God is at work here. May we live expansively enough to see God's hand and courageously enough to leave a sense of smallness behind as we continue to journey toward who God is calling us to be.

We have a new church page on Facebook which has announcements, photos and topical information. We still have the HOPE Garden/Mission page and the Small World page. We also still have our web site.



Please Help! Become a Prepper!


We need one or two more volunteers for fellowship prep. The Mackeys are moving to their new home in PA this month and we are getting desperate to find someone (or two) to help in their place.
