A Message from Pastor Becca

Today is my first day back at the church after two weeks away. For most of that two weeks my family and I were living out of our car as we traveled New England, tent camping, with our dog. This morning I woke up to an alarm clock instead of bird song or waves crashing in the distance. I rushed through the school year version of the morning routine, waved my kiddo off to school, and settled in at my desk. For better or worse we are full swing into the early school year transition. The days grow shorter but the warmth of summer sun remains. Our routines become more structured as we try to squeeze in one last campfire before the weather turns cold.

This spring as I was attending Credo in Virginia, where our focus as pastors is to recognize what it is we need to sustain ourselves in a life of ministry, I made a note; spend more time in creation/nature. I noticed at the retreat center that I felt so energized by the warmth of the sun on my skin. All spring and summer I have tried to get outdoors as much as I could. This trip was designed to keep us outdoors for 9 days, exploring beaches, mountains, and a National Park all while sleeping in a tent. That fresh air does a body, mind, and spirit good.

About halfway through the trip I found myself on an outcropping of rocks, watching the waves crash all around me. The ocean was as beautiful as ever and the scenes took my breath away. Nature can do that, if we pay attention. The waves becoming more than a lulling background sound. They become rushes of wonder and newness reminding me of God, the maker of the waves knows the very hairs on my head. I took a deep breath and took it all in. I reflected on how over the course of the previous days, I had spent little time in structured devotional time, yet I had felt closer to God than I had in a very long time. The spaciousness, the wonder, the beauty had been drawing me in for days and I was aware and in awe of God every moment. I pulled out my phone and snapped this picture because I wanted a shot to remember this moment. The way the day was slipping away, the ocean was pushing in against the rocks, the resilience of seaside trees. I hoped to capture it all. It wasn't until later, I noticed. In the center of the bottom of this picture is a sea creature's tail. I tried zooming it in to no avail. I suspect this was a seal as I had seen others earlier in the week around this spot.



I had been fully present in this moment taking it all in for several minutes before I snapped this shot. I never once noticed any wildlife and I spent time looking for some marine mammals as I am quite fond of them. In a moment's time, I reflected on the astounding beauty of creation, the very real presence of God in my surroundings, and my own response to this experience. I was fully alive in that moment, sea spray on my face, nostrils filled with salt air, and heart sing in harmony with both God and creation. And yet, I missed it, a fellow product of creation at play in the surf or perhaps looking for their next meal. How amazing is it that even when we are fully aware of God and our surroundings, the distraction of technology tucked away, God can show up and surprise us! This is the God of abundance!



Meals-to-Go

On July 17, we began assembling and delivering 30 individually-packaged salads and a protein bar to the Christian Caring Center, every Wednesday. To date, we have supplied 240 of the fresh, nutritious lunches for the homeless in the local areas. We are using environmentally friendly compostable containers and forks. We appreciate the fresh produce donations from the Hope Garden.

If you would like to be a part of this worthwhile new mission project, we could use help assembling the salads each Wednesday, 9 - 10 AM, or delivering these to the CCC in Browns Mills at 10 AM. We will continue until the end of September and plan to restart in May/June 2020.

Dinner Meals

We are also coordinating with area churches that are hosting homeless families as part of the Interfaith Hospitality Network of Burlington County. On Aug 12, we prepared a delicious meal of chili, corn bread, salad and dessert bars – enough to serve 8 people, who were being housed for one week at the Medford Methodist Church. We plan to continue to provide a meal on a quarterly basis to support the IHN mission.
