A Message from Pastor Becca

On March 8, it will be one year since we have worshiped together in the sanctuary of the church building. **On March 14**, my Sunday morning routine will transform once again as I welcome those who are ready back into the sanctuary for the first time in a year. Coming back in is going to look a whole lot different from when we last departed worship, yet it is a step toward what will become our new normal. *The first thing you need to know is that if you are not ready to return to worship, worship will be available online every week.*

If you plan to come to worship, there will be precautions in place. Your session and particularly your reopening team have worked diligently to get the best reopening plan in place for our context. I want to take a moment to thank them for their leadership through these difficult times, their commitment and courage to lead has been a gift to each of us! Throughout this newsletter you will get all the technical information you need in order to fully participate in the in-person part of our hybrid worship. Worship will look different, you will need to wear your mask with your nose and mouth covered the entire service, we will not be singing together, we will not have robust call and response liturgy, we will not be greeting one another, and our seating arrangements will look different. I will be wearing a mask except when I am speaking, and we will have space between myself and the congregation to ensure the safest experience possible. Thanks to a clergy vaccination program, I have had both doses of the COVID 19 vaccine. Despite all the will not, cannot, and changes **we will be together** to worship God.

I want to use this space to talk about our relational commitment to one another as we reenter the building. We are committed to being a church community together, to serving one another in the name of Jesus, and caring deeply for one another. Returning to church amplifies this commitment to care for one another. We often do not know the whole story about a person's life, medical risks, and so forth. Each of us looks at the risks of this pandemic through very personal lenses. We each decide what the risks are worth it for us. When we reenter the building, we do so with a variety of experiences and varying levels of risk taking. Therefore, I remind you that in care for one another, it is of utmost importance that we are absolutely honest and committed to caring for one another. If you have been feeling ill, you need to stay home; if you have been exposed to COVID 19, you need to stay home. This is not because you are not welcome in worship but because of your commitment to loving and caring for your fellow worshipers. You may disagree with some of the precautions, yet they still must be followed, even as some of us are fully vaccinated. This is not a matter of politics, media coverage, or differing opinions, *it is a matter of living our faith*.

I am looking forward to March 14 when I can see your faces (or eyes) again as I lead worship. Please join me in committing to our new way of worship as a means of living our faith and caring for one another. Together we are making strides toward a future that is still unfolding.

February Session Summary

During the February meeting, Session members discussed the responses of the church survey about reopening the church for worship. Based upon the online and oral responses, most members responded that they would favor reopening the church for worship. Enough responders indicated that they would be willing to volunteer as greeters and tech people. Therefore, based upon these responses, **Session approved opening the church for worship**.

The next item that Session discussed was when this should occur. Several dates were brought up, but the date that Session approved was **March 14**. This date allowed for the information to be put in the March newsletter so that members could be notified and reminded of the COVID protocol that must be followed to enter the church. Both of these major decisions allow for Faith Church to worship Easter Sunday inside the church.

Another point of importance was a recent WJ Presbytery Called Meeting. Both Pastor Becca and Ginny Magnus attended this virtual meeting. The Called Meeting was to approve the recommended items that the Transition Team proposed for the reformation of our presbytery. The new name for our presbytery will now be The Presbytery For Southern New Jersey. It will include some additional churches in Burlington County and Monmouth County.







Celebrating Reopening on Sunday March 14

Praise the Lord! After a full year of being closed to in-person worship due to the pandemic, we are now ready to reopen for in-person services. All 3 online worshipping formats will continue for those not quite ready to return. We have developed safety guidelines as required by the West Jersey Presbytery & will highlight them here.

- > All entry and exit to the church will be via the side door at the parking lot & entry into the sanctuary will be from the middle side door only. Masks must be worn from the time we leave our cars until we return after the service.
- Pews have been marked off with social distancing in mind & have orange tape where people may sit. Some pews are blocked off completely. Thank you, Joyce
 - S. for our unique sleep mat strips being used for that purpose. A Greeter will be available to help you with the new layout.



- There will be no singing or verbal responses during worship at this time. Offering will be by drop in basket or you can continue with online giving. Fellowship time will not be safely possible at this time.
- The sanctuary will be sanitized before & after each service.
- There will be no Christian Education at this time.
- Communion will be offered using self-contained & individual juice with wafer. These will be picked up as you enter the church. Masks can be dropped briefly to partake of the elements depending on your comfort level.
